## Perennial Plant Association to Host Dallas Symposium

On October 7, 2016, the Perennial Plant Association (PPA) will host "Sustainable Style" in Dallas, Texas. This symposium will showcase an inspiring and knowledgeable group of speakers to address sustainability issues with landscape aesthetics in mind.
