Shinoda Foundation Awards \$20,000 in Scholarships

The Shinoda Foundation has awarded 12 more scholarships to bright young horticulture students from across the country.

In addition, the Foundation awarded a \$1,000 California Floral Council Scholarship to Cal Poly University Senior Jacob Mattlin. The award is available only to applicants residing in California.
