Meadows Scholarship Endowment Fund is a 501 (c) 3 corporation providing scholarships to students who are residents of these 16 southeastern states—Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, Missouri, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia and West Virginia—pursuing a career in horticulture. The scholarship is dedicated to the late Sidney B. Meadows, a past president of the Southern Nursery Association, who believed that providing financial aid for students was an important way to ensure the growth and development of all facets of the industry.

With this year's awards, the fund has awarded a total of \$626,000 since the fund was established in 1989. The fund's current assets are now more than \$950,000.
