Soil," which described representatives from Jiffy and Premier Peat Moss presenting their "best cases" for using peat -lite mixes as alternatives to field soil. It sounded similar to today's discussions that focus on alternatives to peat.

Or the April 1972 feature "Man's Battle with the Insect," which opened with: "What was once the routine use of chemicals to control insects has turned into a pitched battle between the environmentalists and the chemical companies." Reading those words was telling of how our industry's challenges—and solutions—evolve over time.

Fittingly, AFE was featured in the July 2025 issue of *GrowerTalks* highlighting decades of our funded research that helped growers tackle many challenges described in those old articles. It's a reminder that while issues evolve, solutions continue to emerge through industry-driven science. The past decade has brought rapid change: new pests and diseases, rising input costs, tighter regulations, labor shortages, and shifting consumer expectations.
