


A Unanimous Pruning Resource

I featured a subscriber's question about how to prune perennials in the last newsletter and ask if you knew of any resources. Several of you replied, and the answer was unanimous.

By unanimous referrals, the best resource for pruning perennials is *The Well-Tended Perennial Garden* by Tracy DiSabato-Aust. It was originally published in 1998 and was revised and expanded in 2006 and again most recently in 2017. Here's how the submitters described the book:

- "... a good reference for pruning."
- "The best resource is an old one but still the best there is. Tracy DiSabato-Aust wrote *The Well-Tended Perennial Garden* in 1998, but the pruning information is all excellent."
- "Tracy's focus is on plants in the garden. The book gives species by species maintenance and pruning techniques, gleaned from personal experience and interviews."


