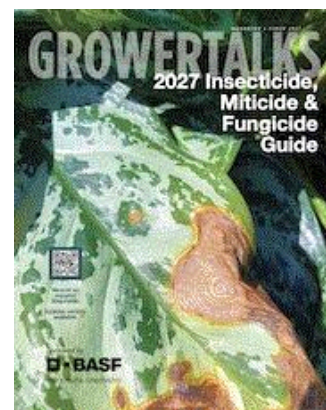
Watch Out Pests!

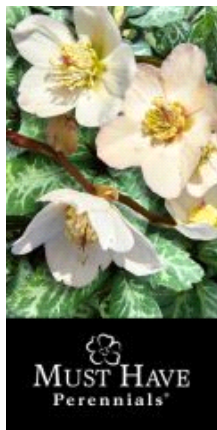
